Michele French of Cabot School District

Michele French has served as principal of Ward Central Elementary in Cabot for 16 years. Before she was principal, French was a kindergarten teacher, kindergarten specialist and district HIPPY coordinator, and an Arkansas State HIPPY coordinator over Training and Technical Assistance Center at ACH. Michele has been president and conference chair of the Arkansas Early Childhood Association and Wilbur Mills Zone Director for Arkansas Association of Elementary School Principals. She has also published a book entitled *Can You Really Say NO? Standards and Good Practice Work Together!* On receiving Master Principal Designation, Michele remarked, "The Leadership Academy had me hooked after the first meeting the first year. The total package worked! The assignments and planning I did changed our school. Our staff has become a community of learners, our community and parents have voice in the school, and our students have shown progress over the years. She is a member of the Arkansas Association of Education Administrators, Arkansas Association of Elementary School Principals, and National Education Association among others. The Master Principal Program was authorized by Act 44 of 2003 and is designed to develop leadership skills of principals through three phases of professional development. More than 500 principals from 70 counties have participated in Phase I of the program, and, of those 500 principals, 112 have continued through the process to Phase II, III, or Designation. Currently, only six other Master Principals have been designated. Phase I of the Master Principal Program is open to all school principals with at least one year of experience and who have support from their superintendents to participate.
